BACH–MIND, BODY AND SOUL

Welcome to our 2024 season Bach – Mind, Body and Soul. What is it that makes Bach so special amongst musicians? What is it that elevates him far above his peers and those who have come before and after? After much contemplation on the subject, I concluded that this year's program must act as a musical deep dive into those aspects of the man which define his genius, still leaving us in awe. Our aim is to explore Bach in mind, body and soul.

In our first program, we delve into Bach as a benefactor. Throughout his life, he mentored many students including his own children, but was also passionate about those in his community who needed help. Thus, we present his cantata "Brich dem Hungrigen dein Brot" (Bring the hungry your bread) BWV 39, written to encourage the people of Leipzig to help those less fortunate, and his timeless cantata "Herz und Mund und Tat und Leben" (Heart and mouth and deed and life) BWV 147 which embodies Bach's deep commitment to his faith and people.

But what about his mind? His unique intellect gave him the ability to create works of staggering complexity, beauty and perfection which we will explore in our second concert series of the year titled 'Bach – The Mind of a Genius'. Featuring selections from his Goldberg Variations, Das Wohltemperierte Klavier, his Violin Concerto in A minor, and his Musical Offering, we explore what it is that elevates Bach's music to the realms of genius.

That mind served to enable his body to cope with extraordinary feats of stamina throughout his life, including completing a journey on foot of over 400kms to learn from his idol Dietrich Buxtehude. This incredible feat of endurance is explored musically in our third program of the year 'In the Steps of Bach – The Road to Lübeck'. Australian organist Marko Sever will take us on a journey from Arnstadt to Lübeck through the works of composers Bach took with him on his journey, culminating in his masterpiece, the cantata 'Vergnügte Ruh, beliebte Seelenlust' BWV 170.

However, it is his soul and deep generosity of spirit that frames and inspires our final program of this year. The Christmas Oratorio is nothing short of a musical miracle. It tells the Christmas story over 6 cantatas, representing the 6 feast days of the Christmas period, containing some of Bach's most touching but joyful music. In this music, Bach's unique mind, body and spirit combine. Through the precious notes he wrote, he has given us a gift of immeasurable delight and wonder for all generations to come.

he Bach family spent their lives in service. After four generations of practicing musicians, J.S. Bach was no different. He was a passionate educator, pedagogue, school master and mentor to his own many children and those of the Thomasschule of which he was Cantor. With a strong social conscience, he composed music to enrich, instruct and inspire the lives of all. Bach Akademie Australia presents a program featuring Bach's cantata 'Brich dem Hungrigen dein Brot', dubbed the 'refugee cantata', thought to have welcomed the arrival into Germany of Protestant refugees banished from Salzburg. Composed in Cöthen, his Harpsichord Concerto in E arranged for violin is a shining example of clever adaptation, which he used later in his career as a tool for teaching his students. We end with his famous cantata 'Herz und Mund und Tat und Leben' BWV 147, which perfectly encapsulates Bach's desire that our hearts, mouths, deeds and lives be in service to humanity and to God.







t was the autumn of 1705. A young 20 year old Bach began a journey on foot of almost 400 kilometres from Arnstadt in the heart of Germany, to Lübeck near the Baltic coast. Who would undertake such a gruelling expedition? Only one such as J.S. Bach, whose desire to study the art and craft of the famous organist Dietrich Buxtehude, drove him to complete a journey most would baulk at – such was his desire to learn from his idol and better himself as a musician. Buxtehude's music proved to be a beacon of inspiration for Bach, changing the course of music forever. Featuring the Australian organist Marko Sever and Baritone Andrew O'Connor, we chart the journey to Lübeck through music of the great masters Bach took with him, ending with Bach's Cantata BWV 170 which so perfectly encapsulates the results of such inspiration on the mind of a genius.
